
REFLECTOR

We are in the process of scanning and digitizing every issue of the Reflector, our school newspaper, so that we have a more permanent, digital archive. The long, tedious process got us thinking about how much information and history is recorded in all those pages. When we are finished, we will communicate how people will be able to access the archived issues. We really think you will enjoy reading through the old Reflectors and are confident that it will bring back good memories.

From the very beginning, students have voiced their opinions on a variety of topics in the school newspaper. In the first year (1945), a mimeographed sheet, called the I-O-Way was published several times. But it was in the second year, on December 16, 1946, that the **Reflector** became a permanent bi-weekly publication.

Over the years, the paper took on many different forms. The title heading was always some sort of hand drawn design up until 1962 when then editor. Mary Alice Bontrager '64 took over. The look of the paper made a noticeable change, but so did the content as Bontrager's editorial mentions, "When something new and completely different comes out, most of us are skeptical about it at first. It may he be better than before, or it may be worse. We editors hope that you find this new Reflector the kind of newspaper you like. Most of all, we want this newspaper to be one you enjoy."





The paper was a major part of school life for almost forty years, but was discontinued and the last regular issue was printed in 1982. The *Reflector* was later revived in 1996 by the Computer Applications class taught by Jane Miller F '87-09. The first semester class decided to try to resurrect the paper in place of a final exam. Miller mentioned that, "The use of modern computers makes the layout much easier, no longer are the days of typing the copy at least twice in order to get justified margins."

Over the years following, the Reflector was printed off and on but with no regularity and in the spring of 2016, through the action of **Gretta Rempel '19**, the paper was most recently revived. The paper has taken on many different looks over the years. Today's staff composed of students from all grades publishes everything from local news, sports updates, reviews, comics, top-ten lists, and advice in the monthly periodical.

Here is the cover of the latest issue from December featuring senior, Esther Hughes, participating in one of the Advent activities the week before Christmas break. Unfortunately for her, closely analyzing the jar to make an accurate guess did not make her the winner.

ABOUT THE **COVER** | Under the direction of editor Robert Bontrager '59, from 1957-59, for the first and only time, the Reflector featured a full-front page design. These issues also noted that the paper would be published monthly by students and the subscription price was \$0.75 or \$1.00 if mailed.

DWIGHT GINGERICH 700 WINS

On November 3rd, 1981, our boys basketball team beat Shellsburg 45-31. That was also the first career win for first-year head coach Dwight Gingerich '76. He was just getting started. Fast forward to his 40th season when coach Gingerich won his 700th game on December 11, 2021 beating Rivermont Collegiate 63-26. On that November day back in 1981, little did the young, enthusiastic coach know about the role he would play in the lives of so many student athletes not just at our school, but in the community. It wasn't just the white socks or the preseason haircuts; the impact that Gingerich had on his players was something that soaked into their soul just like sweat into their tucked in practice jerseys.

But it wasn't just basketball. Gingerich's coaching success wasn't only in a sport with two baskets; it also included a sport with a net strung across the hardwood. Gingerich coached girls varsity volleyball from 1995-2007 and again for one year in 2010. As a volleyball coach, Gingerich had the opportunity to directly impact even more lives. During those years, more than 80 players, 7 different assistant coaches, and a handful of managers were a part of his teams. Overall, in both sports Gingerich coached a combined 43 All-State athletes, 30 in basketball and 13 in volleyball.

Following the Alumni Night game on December 21, 2021, to celebrate this incredible accomplishment, everyone kept their seats in Hillcrest Union as a video played featuring almost 60 former players, managers, and assistant coaches who were a part of Gingerich's success (which can be viewed at hillcrestravens.org/700wins). Following the video presentation, everyone was invited to congratulate Gingerich in the main lobby at a cookie reception of sugar cookies in the shape of the number 700.
